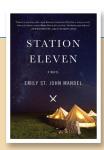

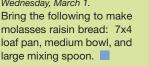

"Becoming a citizen is my tribute to this country that welcomed me... that taught me the value of liberty and justice."



In June, the Community Family Literacy Project will award scholarships to adult library users who are studying to pass the U.S. citizenship exam.
