## Another 0% Budget Increase

The library board of trustees and library director announce that there will be ***no increase to the library budget for the second year in a row***. In considering the proposed budget for the coming year, the board of trustees was able to craft a budget with a zero percent increase. The 2017-2018 budget of \$9,699,000 is the same amount as it was for 2015-2016 AND 2016-2017. The tax levy for 2017-2018 will remain at \$9,214,000. As such, ***there will be no budget vote this year***.

The estimated tax rate associated with the proposed operating budget is \$28.04 per \$100 of assessed valuation, which equates to an estimated annual levy of \$700.88 for an average household (based on an assessed valuation of \$2,500).
