Chamber of Commerce Christmas Parade



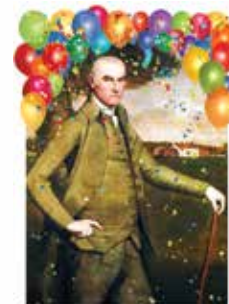
Sunday, December 3, 12:00 noon

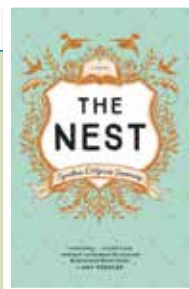
