Citizenship Scholarship Fund

"Becoming a citizen is my tribute to this country that welcomed me ... that taught me the value of liberty and justice."

In June, the Community Family Literacy Project will award scholarships to adult library patrons who are studying to pass the U.S. citizenship exam. Scholarship eligibility requires legal permanent U.S. residence status and regular participation in the citizenship preparation class. Recipients are chosen based on qualifying essay, exam, and interview.

Application to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services costs \$725.
