MARGARET MITCHELL, 1936, FIC MITCHELL


After the Civil War sweeps away the genteel life to which she has been accustomed, Scarlett O'Hara sets about to salvage her plantation home.

D.H. LAWRENCE, 1928, FIC LAWRENCE


Trapped in her sexless marriage to the invalid Sir Clifford, Constance Chatterley seeks a release in a passionate love affair with her husband's gamekeeper.

EDITH WHARTON, 1920, FIC WHARTON


Newland Archer begins to question the values of high society in Victorian New York when he finds himself torn between two very different women--his proper young fiancée and her exotic cousin.

BRAM STOKER, 1897, FIC STOKER


