


THE ART OF SAYING GOODBYE

Paisley Lamm's terminal cancer helps her and her four friends suddenly appreciate their memorable life experiences, their own families and their lifestyles.




HOW TO EAT A CUPCAKE

When childhood friends, Annie and Julia, reconnect as adults and decide to open a cupcakery, they must overcome old betrayals, first loves, and a dangerous threat.




BAREFOOT SEASON




THE RED BOOK




FOUR OF A KIND

Lumped together as the Diversity Committee of a tony private school in NYC, four moms overcome early misconceptions over poker games during which they confess secrets and endure challenges.




THE PROPER CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF FRIENDSHIP




FRIENDSHIP BREAD: A NOVEL
