




The Girl on the Cliff: a Novel




The Heather Blazing: a Novel

It is Ireland in the late twentieth century. Eamon Redmond is a judge in the Irish High Court who is beginning to discover how painfully unconnected he is from other human beings.




The House on Willow Street: a novel




The Sea

Following the death of his wife, Max Morden retreats to the seaside town of his childhood summers, where his own life becomes inextricably entwined with the members of the vacationing Grace family.




The Secret Scripture: a Novel
