

BEN FOUNTAIN, 2012, FIC FOUNTAIN



RALPH PETERS, 2012, FIC PETERS



GERALDINE BROOKS, 2005, FIC BROOKS



E.L. DOCTOROW, 2005, FIC DOCTORO


Union General William Tecumseh Sherman's devastating march through Georgia and the Carolinas during the final years of the Civil War has a profound impact on the outcome of the war.

KARL MARLANTES, 2004, FIC MARLANTES



JEFF SHAARA, 1998, FIC SHAARA




