




Fast Food Nation: The Dark Side of the All-American Meal


A journalist explores the homogenization of American culture and the impact of the fast food industry on modern day health, economy, politics, popular culture, entertainment, and food production.




Isaac's Storm: A Man, A Time, and the Deadliest Hurricane in History




A Moveable Feast




Nickel and Dimed: On (not) Getting By In America




Under the Banner of Heaven: A Story of Violent Faith

An autobiographical portrait of marriage and motherhood by the acclaimed author details her struggle to come to terms with life and death, illness, sanity, personal health, and upheaval.

Describes how Abdulrahman Zeitoun remained in New Orleans during Hurricane Katrina, his subsequent efforts to help other victims, his disappearance a week later, and the effect of these events on his wife and children.
