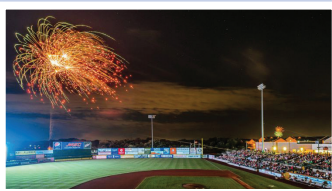
Long Island Ducks Game

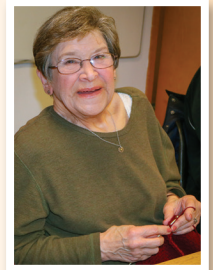

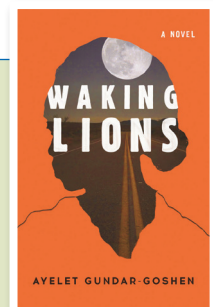
