Important Library Board Meeting on Building Proposal

Monday, October 28, 7:00 p.m.

Community members are invited to an important meeting to learn about the proposed repairs and improvements to our facilities and the cost associated with them. The library board has finalized a new renovation proposal to present to the community.

The plan would fully restore and repair the 45,000-square-foot **Main Library** building, as well as make major technological upgrades. In addition, the proposal is to renovate and expand the building we recently purchased in Mastic Beach to become a 7,000-square-foot **Mastic Beach Branch**. Finally, the plan includes construction of a 7,000-square-foot building along Montauk Highway in Moriches on 3 or 4 acres of land that the William Floyd School District has offered us. The **Moriches Branch** would be convenient to the growing population living in the eastern portion of the library district.

The anticipated cost of the bond is an additional \$85 annually for the average assessed home in the community. Plans to Save the Little Red Schoolhouse

The Library Board of Trustees has reached a compromise with community leaders to save the Little Red Schoolhouse in Moriches.

“One of the many benefits of the passage of our proposed December 10 bond vote will be the preservation and restoration of the Little Red Schoolhouse,” said Board President Joseph Maiorana. “After numerous discussions with our community partners, including civic leaders, the library has committed to work with the community to try to restore the Little Red Schoolhouse. It is hoped the Moriches Branch would include new construction of 5,000 to 7,000 square feet in the same architectural style of the existing Little Red Schoolhouse to be built to the rear of the 94-year-old structure. Ultimately, it is envisioned that the new library building would be connected to the restored Little Red Schoolhouse through a breezeway. It is envisioned that the restored Little Red Schoolhouse will serve as a large community program / meeting room for the benefit of local residents.”

School district officials have indicated that if the library does not take possession of the Moriches property, the deteriorating Little Red Schoolhouse will be taken down before it becomes a safety hazard. ■

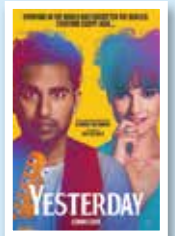
