## *A Message from the Board: Update on Facilities*

### **A Three-Pronged Approach**

After more than a year of meetings and public presentations addressing the building's problems, the library board continues to seek feedback on the following possible solution, which includes a renovation of our main facility and the creation of annexes to serve both Mastic Beach and Moriches. The board is committed to keeping the cost of this plan under \$100/year for the average assessed home in the district. It is the intention of the board to hold a vote on this three-pronged approach later this year. Please continue to attend our meetings and provide feedback. ### **Main Library Renovation**

A renovation of the main building allows for the library to remain where it is but go through major alterations to meet the 21st-century needs of the community. The renovation would create defined program spaces, additional meeting rooms, and ADA accessible restrooms. It would abate the asbestos, add fireproofing and insulation to the building, replace aging portions of the roof and HVAC/lighting/IT wiring/security cameras, as well as remove the existing leaking main skylight. Staff offices would be moved to the lower level, creating more space for the public on main floors.

### **Mastic Beach Annex**

The library board purchased the former Village Hall at 369 Neighborhood Road with the intention of using the building as an annex. The Old Village Hall does not have quite enough space to act as a temporary base of operations if our main facility is closed for renovations, as is part of our current plan. However, plans could add an addition to make the building large enough for this purpose. The facility is approximately 4,000 sq. ft. and could be expanded to 7,000 sq. ft. without variances.

### **Moriches Annex**

The library board is in discussions with the William Floyd School District about giving the library approximately 3-4 acres, which includes the Little Red School House, at no cost. The existing building does not meet the standards needed to house a library and would need to be demolished in order to build an appropriate structure. In this scenario, the existing building architecture would be replicated into a new design. As the property is free, the cost of demolition of the existing structure is much less expensive than other properties examined for purchase.

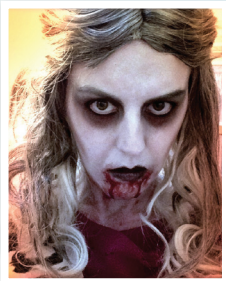

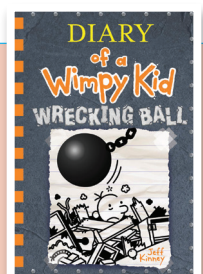
