IT'S OVERDUE! Library Bond Vote

WHY DO WE NEED THIS REFERENDUM?

- We need to make critical and urgent repairs to our main library in Shirley. These renovations will take two years to complete.
- To maintain continuity of services for our community's families during the two-year renovation period, we will serve library patrons from two new satellite branches in Mastic Beach and Moriches. Once renovations to our main library are complete, the two branches will remain open permanently.

WHY DOES OUR CURRENT LIBRARY REQUIRE EXTENSIVE RENOVATIONS?

- Our building is old and it no longer complies with multiple building codes.
- It is technologically obsolete – and physically obsolete – in many ways.



WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF HAVING THREE LIBRARY LOCATIONS INSTEAD OF ONLY ONE?

- The current building is too small to serve our growing population.
- Patrons have long complained that our present library is situated beyond their reasonable geographic reach.
- The two new branches will greatly improve library access for residents of Mastic Beach and Moriches.
- With three library facilities instead of one, we'll have more space and flexibility for scheduling programming.
- The two new branches will each offer much needed outdoor programming space.
- For a great many of our families, it will be faster and easier – and safer – to get to the library.

WHAT WOULD APPROVAL OF THE BOND COST ME?

- Adoption of the bond would cost the average taxpayer about \$7 per month.
