Fine-Free Pilot Project

For a trial period, the library will not charge overdue fines for most borrowed items (not including high-demand items). All current outstanding overdue fines will be waived. If you've held onto borrowed items because you worried about the late fines, now's a great time to return to the library!

Fine-free doesn't mean responsibility-free. Patrons who keep library items out past their due dates will be blocked from borrowing more until the overdue items are returned. Lost and damaged charges still apply. ■



Trustee Election at the Library

The library is governed by a five-member board of trustees, elected by the voters of the district. One trustee is elected each year for a five-year term. In order to vote you must be: 1) 18 years of age or older; 2) a U.S. citizen; 3) a resident of the district for at least 30 days; 4) registered to vote.

Voter registration will take place at the library on Tuesday, March 31, 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. ■



No Tax Increase for 2020

The library trustees are pleased to announce that there will be a zero percent tax increase for 2020. Thanks to strong financial controls and good budgeting practices, we are able to hold the line on the operating budget. The board understands the tax burdens local families face. We appreciate the community's support of the recent bond vote.

As a result, there will be no budget vote this year. The tax levy for 2020-2021 will remain at \$9,578,000. The estimated tax rate associated with the operating budget is \$29 per \$100 of assessed valuation, which equals an estimated annual tax of \$579 for the average household (based on an assessed valuation of \$1,995).
