PRESCHOOL ACTIVITY IDEA

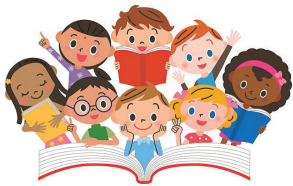
Puzzles are great for preschoolers! They help develop planning, problem solving, and fine motor skills, as well as eye-hand coordination. When children work on puzzles, they must pay attention to details, and practice visual discrimination - as well as patience!

But maybe your children have been doing the same puzzles over and over...it's easy to make some new DIY puzzles with items you're likely to have on hand. You can make them single

or double sided and cut them up according to your child's age and ability. Cut them in ways that will challenge, but not frustrate, your child. Remember that he/she will be figuring out how to put the puzzle together according to the picture, as well as the shapes and the negative space that they are seeing.



People often use cereal boxes...but I didn't have any. I found a colorful biscotti box (finished the biscotti to help the cause!) and decided to make the puzzle 2-sided by pasting an old calendar page of a beautiful bird to the back of the box. Trace the picture to fit the box, glue them together, and grab your scissors! - Miss Debbie. ■

Community Library Pumpkin Picking at Glover Farm



Cloudy weather and muddy feet couldn't keep families away from the Community Library's traditional "On the Road" pumpkin picking event last week. Everyone masked up to meet up for a safe and fun time at Glover Farms.

For the seventh consecutive year, the Community Library Children's and Parents' Services Department hosted over 400 people at five different sessions. Each registered family member was given free admission along with coupons for ten pounds of pumpkins and a corn maze adventure. Glover Farms also offers a haystack for climbing, a mini-hay maze for little ones, a playground, barnyard animals to visit and a tractor ride out to the pumpkin field as part of the visit. Families

took advantage of the many idyllic photo opportunities around the farm and everyone had a wonderful time and left with wagons full of pumpkins and plenty of smiles.

CPSD department head Sylvia Maurer launched the pumpkin picking program in 2014, and it remains one of the most popular library activities. "It's a great program that we run every year that gives families an opportunity to experience a great fall activity together and also brings the community together as they get to see all their friends and meet new ones." In COVID times, it's especially important for families to find safe social activities, and this was an excellent opportunity. Families had plenty of space to spread out in the fresh air. Masks were worn when social distance could not be observed as well as inside the snack bar, where farm visitors enjoyed a wide array of treats including roasted corn, hot pretzels and fresh cider donuts. Irresistible fresh apples and golden local honey were available at the check-out.

Children's library page Daria Fatizzo was on hand checking in families. She enjoyed seeing children she hasn't seen in months due to the pandemic.

"I was so happy to get to see everyone as they were so excited to go through the corn maze, pick pumpkins, and eat some yummy snacks," she said. "Afterwards, the children would be ecstatic to show us the pumpkins that they picked out, some families walked out with huge pumpkins, while others chose multiple smaller ones".

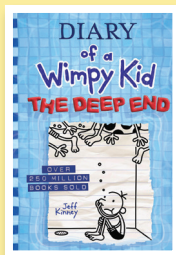

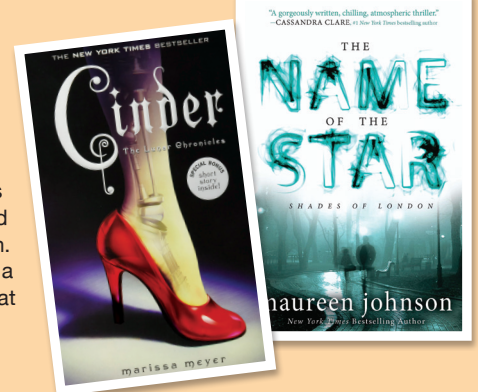

Paint: DecoArt Americana - Warm Beige, Slate Grey, Tomato Red, Dried Clay, Antique Maroon, Warm White, Graphite, Lamp Black.

Brushes: 10/0 liner, #2 rigger, shaders #10, #12, small drybrush, 1/2" filbert rake. Palette knife. Optional materials: wood filler, modeling paste, Glamour Dust Ice Crystal, small piece of white Boa. Optional: Carefully remove pom-pom, mustache and nose (you will glue back on). Using wood filler, fill the slats (I did not do hat), sand and repeat, and then base as above. ■

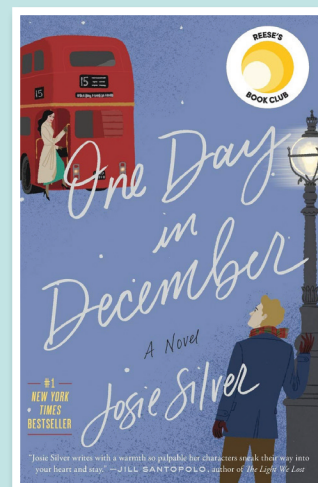
