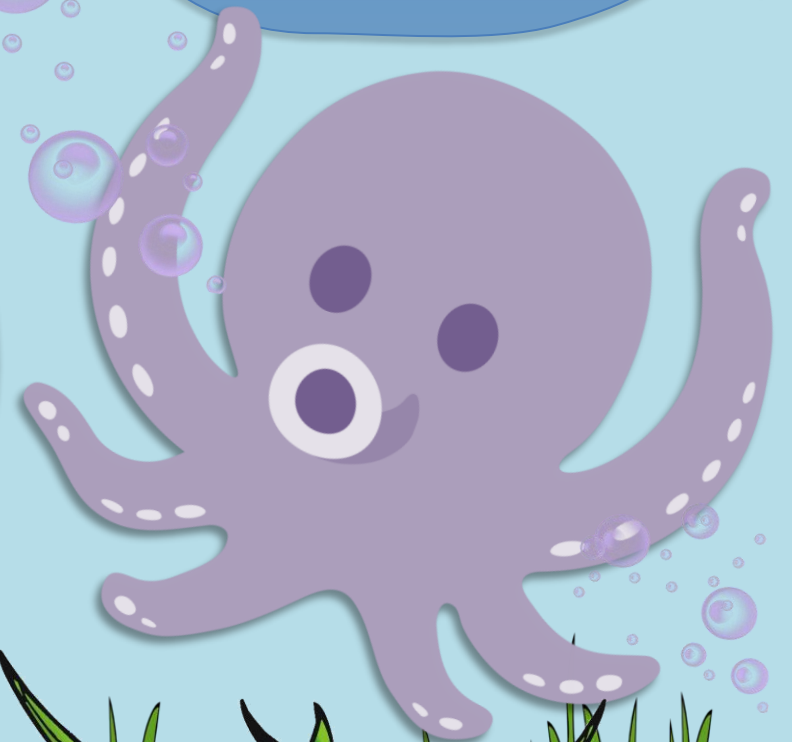
Mr. Octopus Song

Pipe Cleaner Octopus

- 1) Gather all your pipe cleaners together, bind up one end with a rubber band.
- 2) Splay out the gathered pipe cleaners, then rearrange them so that they alternate colors. Then wrap the pipe cleaners around the Styrofoam ball.
- 3) Bind the pipe cleaners together on the other side of the ball with the other rubber band.
- 4) Take two pipe cleaners of different colors and wind them together so that they create a swirl pattern like a candy cane. Repeat for the rest of the pipe cleaners to create 8 legs.
- 5) Take a pencil or pen, then wrap a leg around it. Repeat for each leg until all of them are curly.
- 6) Glue the googly eyes to the head of your octopus.

Materials

- 1 Styrofoam Ball
- 16 pipe cleaners (8 of one color, 8 of another)
- 2 Googly Eyes
- 2 Rubberbands
- Glue and Scissors
