Dinosaur Succulent Garden

Materials

- Planter Pot
- Potting Soil/Sand/Pebbles
- Dinosaur Toys
- Decorative Rocks
- 3-4 Small Succulent Plants



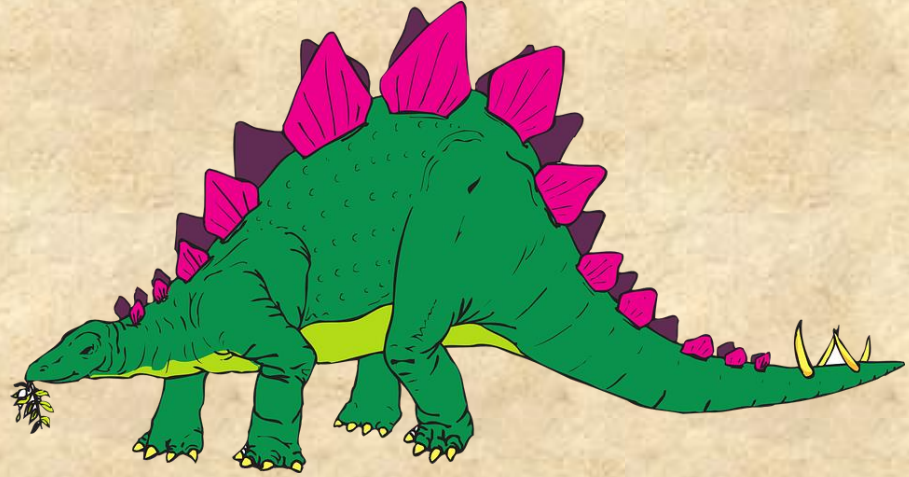
Instructions

- 1) Add a thin layer of pebbles or sand on the bottom of your pot, to help with water drainage.
- 2) Fill the rest of the pot with potting mix, stopping an inch or so below the top.
- 3) Plant the succulents around the pot, add decorative rocks wherever you like.
- 4) Arrange your dinosaur toys to complete the scene.

SUCCULENTS

Succulents are desert plants. They are used to heat and dry weather. During the summer, you can leave your Dinosaur Garden outside with no problem. However, make sure to take it back inside when it's raining. You should water your garden only when it needs it. A good rule is to soak the soil once, then wait until it completely dries before soaking it again.
