Recycled Bottle Cat Container

Instructions

- 1) Clean out your bottle with soap and water. Remove the label as best you can. You can use sandpaper if it sticks on.
- 2) Trace the outline of the cat's ears and tail about a third of the way up from the bottom of the bottle, all the way around. The ears should be on one side of the bottle, the tail on the other side.
- 3) Use scissors to cut around the outline, removing the top of the bottle from the bottom. You may need to punch a hole in the bottle to get started with the scissors.
- 4) Draw a cat face on the bottle, below the cat ears. Eyes, nose, mouth, and whiskers will do it.
- 5) Place combs, toothbrushes, and anything else you like in your new cat holder. Place it by your sink, hang it in the shower from the tail, or keep it in your room.

Materials

- Empty shampoo/lotion bottle
- Scissors
- Black Sharpie
