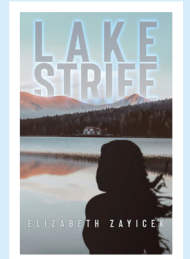


Author Talk and Book Signing of *Lake Strife*

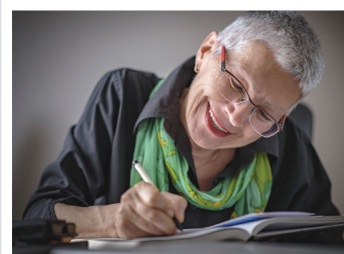
