Trustee Election/Vote at the Library

Vote is Tuesday, April 5, 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

Voter Registration at the Library: Tuesday, March 29, 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The library is governed by a five-member board of trustees, elected by the voters of the district. One trustee is elected each year for a five-year term. In order to vote you must be: (1) 18 years of age or older, (2) a U.S. citizen, (3) a resident of the district for at least 30 days, and (4) registered to vote.



DEAR LIBRARY PATRONS:

The Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library will hold a budget vote and trustee election on Tuesday, April 5.

The proposed \$10,795,000 operating budget for the 2022-2023 fiscal year includes a modest 2.4 percent tax increase which stays within the NYS tax cap.

"The library district has demonstrated an ongoing commitment to fiscal responsibility," said Joseph A. Maiorana, President of the library Board of Trustees. "The increase reflected in our proposed operating budget represents only the second tax increase over the past seven years."

"The library board has an admirable record of holding the line on taxes and spending," commented Library Director Kerri Rosalia. "This proposed budget reflects the importance we place on financial prudence."

Library patronage has been high, even through the pandemic. It has historically had one of the highest usage rates among all libraries throughout Suffolk County.

Mr. Maiorana attributed the rise in operating expenses to increasing fixed costs associated with IT databases, books, media, utilities, and contractual employee obligations. The library has also sustained increased expenses associated with COVID-19 prevention and maintenance. The proposed library budget also reflects our commitment to continuous improvement of library services for our community.

The renovation of both facilities has been proceeding on schedule and under budget, with completion of both satellite facilities anticipated for this coming summer and fall. At that time, the main library at 407 William Floyd Parkway in Shirley will be closed for renovations for an estimated 18-24 months. During that time, library services will be provided by the two newly opened satellite branches.

The only trustee position up for a vote on April 5 is the seat held by Wendy Gross, who is running for reelection. Ms. Gross, who has served on the board since 2012, is the current board Vice President.

The library district will conduct a budget hearing on March 28, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. the library. District residents are encouraged to attend.



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Voting will take place on Tuesday, April 5, 2022, from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Community Library. In order to vote, you must be: (1) 18 years of age or older, (2) a citizen of the U.S., (3) a resident of the district for at least 30 days, and (4) registered to vote.

The estimated tax rate associated with the proposed operating budget is \$31.94 per \$100 of assessed valuation, which equates to an estimated annual levy of \$798.50 for an average household (based on an assessed valuation of \$2,500).
