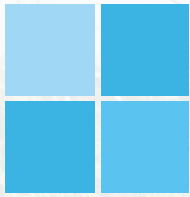


We are very fortunate to have the support of our New York State elected officials, who sent

Book Discussion of *Nine Perfect Strangers*

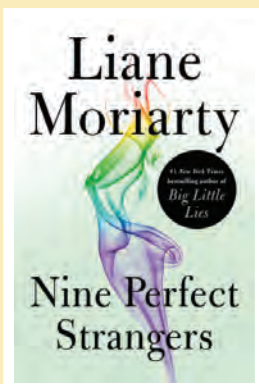
