## Mastic Beach Branch Grand Opening



**The Mastic Beach Satellite Branch on Neighborhood Road opened on January 14th** to hundreds of excited patrons!

Local elected officials, civic group members, school board members, plus fire and police department officials welcomed the community to 7,000 square feet of brand-new library space on one level with ample parking, an outdoor program area, and a one-acre library park across the street. 369 Neighborhood Rd. is walkable, bikeable and a safe welcoming center for a vibrant downtown Mastic Beach.

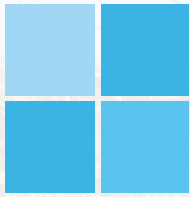


## Library Building Project Update

**The Moriches Satellite Branch** is nearly complete and features 7,000 square feet on one level with convenient parking and a huge outdoor yard for program space. We are busy moving in library materials and setting up the space for all the programs you enjoy. We are awaiting final fire inspections and CO - keep an eye out for a grand opening announcement sometime in February/March 2023.

**Main Library Status** - The Fire Spraying work in all of the lower levels just wrapped up last week. The prep and lath work will continue on the roof level for about another month. Most of the concrete work will be completed by the end of January (new elevator foundation/slab patch work in the community room/revised foundation at entrance/all remedial work from engineer). Steel will go into fabrication and we look to get a lot of that installed in February. Plumbing submittals are in with the engineer, once approved they will mobilize to complete their saw cutting and underground work in February. Exterior carpentry was recently bid out. Once awarded, this work should start end of February/beginning of March.

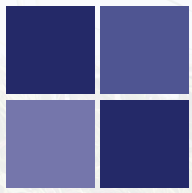

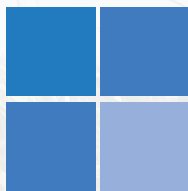

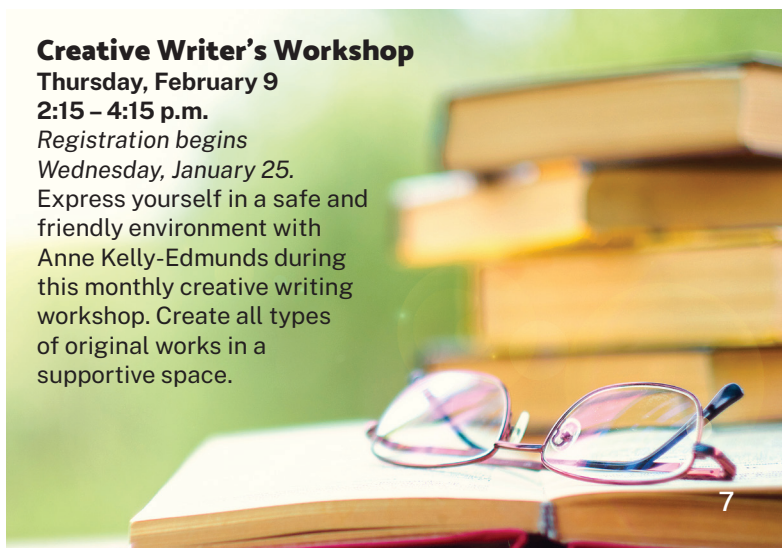
