#### **MINUTES OF AUGUST 25, 2025 BOARD MEETING**

Trustee Maiorana called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.

**CALL TO ORDER** 

Present were Trustees Maiorana, Furnari, Kimmerling and Ricciardi, Director Castro, Business Manager Nowak, and Principal Account Clerk Bertos. Mark Grossman attended as a guest.

PRESENT

#### PERIOD OF PUBLIC EXPRESSION

Joseph Maiorana gave an update on the one million dollar grant that was allotted for the Neighborhood Rd. property that is currently leased from Suffolk County. Mr. Maiorana reported that it looks promising to be able to transfer usage of those funds to the current site that is adjacent to the Mastic Beach branch, as opposed to the original parcel that is opposite the Library.

Motion by Furnari, second by Kimmerling, to accept the minutes of the July 28, 2025 Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees. Carried 4-0.

DIRECTOR

The Library Director began her report by indicating she attended the Suffolk County 250th Celebration Kickoff event held at Sagtikos Manor. She reported that it was well attended. Ms. Castro also met with representatives from Stony Brook Hospital to discuss the implementation of health screenings for underserved communities in Suffolk County and indicated that Mastic Beach may be able to benefit from the programs discussed. The Director also hosted a site visit of the LRS with Legislator J. Mazzarella, Sara Lansdale from Suffolk County government offices, and Joseph Maiorana. Ms. Castro continued her report by indicating she attended a meeting hosted by ClearGov.com, focused on strategic planning best practices. She shared that the program will further staff involvement in strategic planning as well as create transparency in the process. The Director is also scheduled to attend the upcoming Zone 2 Meeting. Tara D'Amato and Ms. Castro completed interviews for security personnel candidates. She also reported they are coordinating with M. Griffin to finalize training dates, set to begin in September to help with new challenges with having three buildings. She took the time to pay special recognition to staff members Maura Feeney, Linda McGarvey, and Jenna Gangi. They have collaboratively launched a Spice Library, complementing the existing Seed Library. Ms. Castro highlighted that the spices are sourced from a minority woman-owned small business in New York City. The Director was excited to report that The Friends of the Arts has generously offered to sponsor a Staff and Family Picnic at Smith Point Beach. Ms. Castro asked Lorraine Squires to report on our new program Library of Things. Ms. Squires was excited to report that the program is up and running and along with Liz Horbal and Sara Roye they are also launching a new library card mascot name Ricardo with the motto "It isn't hard to have fun when you have a library card"

The Business Manager started his report by indicating that the State's paid COVID leave has officially ended. Mr. Nowak was pleased to report that all final repairs that were needed on the Shirley HVAC have been taken care of and we are fully operational. Mr. Nowak reported we received our second of two payments for our contract patron revenue in the amount of approximately \$110,000. He was also pleased to see an increase in our contract patron revenue. Last year's number was \$161,000 to 2024/2025 at \$190,000. Mr. Nowak is working with the Suffolk County Department of Health in reference to our I/A System grant for the Main building. They are requesting signage be implemented. Mr. Nowak indicated because of location that may be challenging. He also reported that we completed Safety Inspections our insurance carrier and they requested two amendments. They indicated that our current

BUSINESS MANAGER Unattended Minors policy is too vague. They also requested that we develop a Hold Harmless Agreement for our Public Displays. Ms. Castro indicated that they are working on an application for displays and a hold harmless policy. Mr. Nowak also indicated that we will be implementing the terms of the latest CSEA MOA.

## Director's Report September 29, 2025

#### 1. Meetings and Outreach

This month included several planning sessions to finalize details for the upcoming William Floyd Alumni Association Author Event. In addition, I met with Nancy Kimmerling to discuss a potential partnership with the William Floyd School District. The goal of this collaboration is to expand inclusive programming across all areas of the library.

#### 2. Professional Development

I attended the SCLS Directors' Meeting at Floyd Memorial Library, where updates were shared on digital downloads, the Summer Tour, and the upcoming budget vote in November. MMSCL also hosted the annual Legislative Breakfast, which drew strong attendance and engagement from community leaders. Later in the month, I participated in the regular PLDA meeting.

#### 3. Library Operations

Department Heads met at the Moriches Branch for their monthly meeting, focusing on communication among departments, branch updates, and strategic planning.

To strengthen security and ensure consistency across all locations, the library is moving forward with a full-time supervisory role to oversee part-time security staff. The new Senior Guard position will provide ongoing training, scheduling, and general oversight. The role has been posted, with the expectation of filling it in early October.

In addition, administration has been working closely with security and the 7th Precinct COPE officers to update and reinforce the library's Code of Conduct Policy, which is being presented at this meeting.

Following a review of the food pantry at the Mastic Beach Branch, it was decided that the library will instead run seasonal food drives. All donations collected will be directed to established food pantries on Neighborhood Road.

#### 4. 250th Celebration Update

Plans for the 1776 style dinner at Sunsets at Senix are now confirmed. The event is scheduled for Thursday, January 22, and will feature historian Eric Jay Dolin, author of *Rebels at Sea: Privateering in the American Revolution* (2022). Tickets will be \$150, with proceeds benefiting the Friends of the Arts nonprofit.

ART DISPLAYS: We've launched our monthly art displays at the main branch and Moriches branch. Each month a different artist from the community will be featured, showcasing their talent and creativity or displaying a unique collection. Maura will be the one networking to coordinate which local artists will be featured each month, I created a spreadsheet for her to easily organize and schedule them well in advance. along with an online form for community members to submit requests through our website should they want to be one of the featured artists. 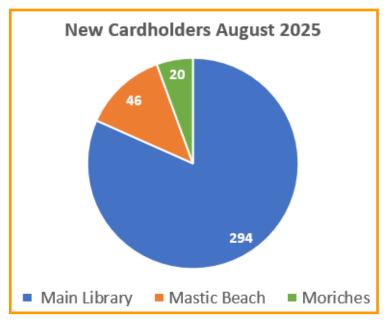

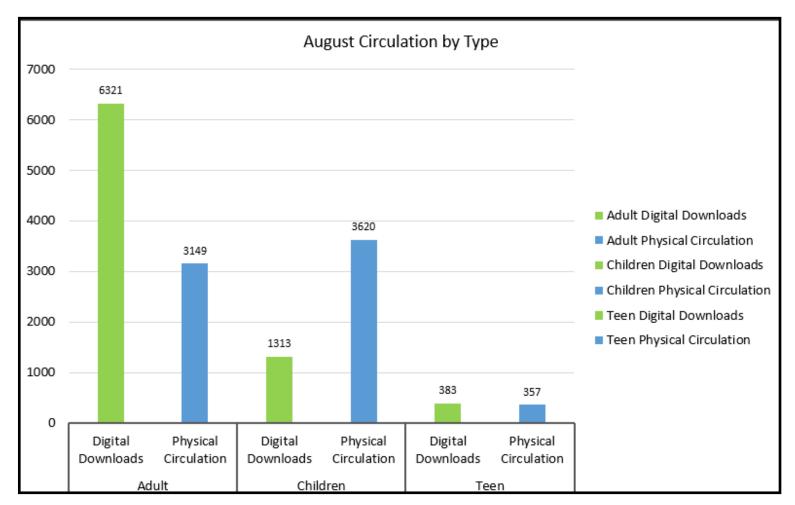

## Children's and Parents' Services Department – September Highlights

September marks a critical time for supporting our patrons as they transition back into the school year. To connect with families and showcase the many free resources available through the library, we actively participated in the William Floyd School District Elementary Meet the Teacher Nights, held on September 10 and 17. These events took place simultaneously across all elementary schools in the district. ## **About the Community Family Literacy Project, Inc.**

The Community Family Literacy Project, Inc. (CFLP) is a nonprofit organization that serves the Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library district, offering programs that educate, empower, and elevate individuals and families. Services include adult education classes, early childhood enrichment, family literacy programs, and outreach events in partnership with community organizations.

## Mastics Moriches Shirley Community Library Art Exhibit Policy

The purpose of art exhibits and displays in the Mastics Moriches Shirley Community Library (MMSCL) shall be for the enhancement of cultural, educational, and recreational pursuits of the Library within the scope of its mission statement. The Library reserves the right to determine what displays will be accepted as well as which pieces shall be exhibited The Library does not censor work. However, artists should be mindful that the gallery is a public area through which children and adults from our community regularly walk.

## Purpose:

To promote the MMSCL services, collections and/or programs.

To highlight current issues, historical information, events or other subjects of community interest.

To gain the community's appreciation of the importance of the arts through exhibitions and displays representing the diverse talent which exists within the community.

#### **Guidelines:**

Exhibitor must complete an application for use of the exhibit space and/or display case. Preference is to be given to exhibitors who possess a current MMSCL card in good standing. Exhibits and displays sponsored by MMSCL will take precedence over individual requests.

Exhibition time is for a one-month period beginning the first of the month.

Exhibitor must provide the Library an inventory list of all items to be displayed.

All art pieces to be displayed must be hung using the library's art hanging system, and must be framed and/or mounted as appropriate and suitable for safe display using wire and D-Style Hangers. Exhibitor must supply all labor involved in hanging and removal of the exhibit. Under no circumstances may the exhibitor place nails, thumbtacks or hooks into the walls of the Library or utilize screw eyes or saw tooth hangers. Exhibitor must install and take down artwork exhibited at a predetermined time to be agreed upon by the Library and Exhibitor. Exhibit must comply with all fire regulations.

Exhibitor must remove all displayed items before the first day of the next month. There is no storage space available. The Library may not grant future exhibitions of the artist if items are not retrieved after one day subsequent to the assigned reservation period.

The MMSCL will not act as intermediary in the sale of artwork. Prices may not be displayed but the artist may supply contact information. No transaction for the purchase or sale of display items may be done on the premises. Should a piece of art work be

sold prior to the end of the exhibition month, the piece should not be removed. A solid dot or sticker may be placed on the frame of any sold piece.

The MMSCL reserves the right to publicize all exhibits which may include but not be limited to the library's newsletter, website and social media.

The MMSCL assumes no responsibility for the theft of or damage to items in an exhibit or display nor does the Library provide insurance. The Exhibitor shall hold the Library harmless from any loss or damage to items accepted for exhibit or display.

#### **Library Code of Conduct**

#### **Policy Statement**

The Mastics Moriches Shirly Community Library (MMSCL) Code of Conduct intended strives to protect the rights and safety of library users, protect the rights and safety of staff members, and preserve and protect the library's materials, facilities and property.

Library users who violate the Code of Conduct may be subject to the suspension of their Library privileges, be excluded from the Library and/or face legal action. Suspension of Library privileges and exclusion from the Library is at the discretion of the Library administration.

#### Regulation

In situations where MMSCL staff members feel that the health, safety or security of library users or staff members are threatened, they may take any and all appropriate action including, but not limited to, calling the police for assistance.

Library staff members may ask a Library user to leave the premises with or without prior warning, depending upon the seriousness of the violation. Library staff members may also exclude a patron or visitor from MMSCL facilities.

The MMSCL Administration may impose a further suspension of Library privileges. If Library Administration decides to impose such a suspension, the patron or visitor will be so advised in writing. Any patron whose Library privileges are suspended under these rules has a right to appeal to the Library Board in writing. The appeal must be submitted to the Library Board within 30 calendar days after the date of the letter advising the patron that their privileges have been suspended.

#### Guidelines

The following behavior is not permitted.

#### Illegal Activities, including but not limited to:

- Committing or attempting to commit any activity that constitutes a violation of any federal, state or local statute or ordinance.
- Engaging in sexual conduct or lewd behavior on Library premises, as defined under New York Penal Law. (New York State Penal Code, Section 245 Public lewdness)
- Use of controlled substances on Library premises. (New York State Penal Code, Section 220)
- Vaping, smoking or other use of tobacco inside Library buildings. (New York State Public Health Code, Section 1399)
- · Drinking alcoholic beverages on Library premises.

#### Harmful, Disruptive, or Destructive behavior, including but not limited to:

- Engaging in conduct that disrupts or interferes with the normal operation of the Library, or disturbs staff and Library users. Such conduct includes:
  - o The use of abusive or threatening language or gestures.
  - o Creation of unreasonable noise.
  - Loud or boisterous behavior or talking, <u>including</u> on a cell phone<u>s or otherwise</u>.
- Using Library materials, equipment, furniture or fixtures in a destructive, abusive
  or potentially damaging manner, in a manner likely to cause personal injury to
  any person or in any other manner inconsistent with the customary use thereof.
- Disobeying the reasonable direction of Library staff members.
- Interfering with the free passage of MMSCL staff members or users in or onto Library premises including, but not limited to, placing objects such as bicycles, strollers, shopping carts or bags in such a manner as to impede free passage in or onto the premises. The Library also reserves the right to limit the size and number of items brought into the Library. The Library will place signage in the Library should there be a limitation on the size or number of items.
- Use of bicycles, scooters, roller-skates, skateboards, wagons, shopping carts or similar wheeled devices in the Library.
- Use of open flame or any burning/heating elements.

#### Other inappropriate behavior:

- Bringing animals other than service animals inside library buildings without the prior permission of Library staff.
- Monopolizing Library space, equipment or outlets so as to preclude or limit the
  use by other patrons/visitors.
- Violating the Library's Food and Drink Policy. A copy of this Policy is posted on the Library's website and at the reference desk.
- Violating the Library's Technology Use Policy. A copy of this Policy is posted on the Library's website and at the reference desk.
- Sleeping in public areas.
- Use of MMSCL restrooms for bathing, shaving, washing hair, or changing clothes.
- Use of any communication or entertainment devices at a volume that disturbs others, with or without headphones.
- Entering Library buildings with bare feet or bare chest.
- Disturbing others because of offensive body odor.
- Unhygienic behavior such as spitting, clipping nails, or changing diapers in public areas.
- Adults or teens not accompanied by a child in the Children's Department or Children's areas.

#### **Unattended Children:**

Formatted: Highlight

- The MMSCL welcomes and encourages children to visit the Library, use <u>its</u> <u>library</u>-resources and services, and attend <u>library-its</u> programs. Staff members are available to help and support children; however, the Library <u>is-cannotnet able</u> to provide short- or long-term <u>child-care\_childcare</u>, or be responsible for unattended children.
- Unattended children are children of any age who are apparently-not unaccompanied by a parent, guardian, and/or responsible caregiver. Children who are unable or unwilling to care for themselves may not be left alone in the Library and must have adequate supervision while in the Library. Unattended children must be able to communicate with staff, be comfortable at the Library on their own and be able to follow the Library Code of Conduct. The Library is not responsible if children an unattended child leaves Library property unattended on their own initiative.
- Parents, guardians, and/or caregivers are responsible for the safety, behavior, and supervision of children at all times in the Library and on Library property.
   Children are expected to adhere to the Library Code of Conduct. <u>If an unattended child violates the Library Code of Conduct, the child and the parent, guardian or caregiver may be subject to a suspension of Library privileges.</u>

Library staff will attempt to contact a parent, guardian, and/or caregiver in circumstances such as the following:

- An unattended child is engaging in behavior that is disruptive to other library users, staff, or the normal operations of library business.
- An unattended child is involved in a situation that is potentially harmful to the health or safety of the child and/or others.
- An unattended child is left alone at the Library at closing time.

Such situations will be handled on a case-by-case basis. If parents, guardians, and/or caregivers cannot be reached, or are unresponsive, the Library will work with other government agencies as needed, including Suffolk County Police and/or Suffolk County Department of Social Services.
